In a strange incident, a 74-year-old man who had been rescued from a freezer in Tamil Nadu after spending over 24 hours inside the box alive. The old man had been stuffing in the freezer, meant for corpses, and while still alive after a private hospital in Salem district declared him dead.



Critically-ill Balasubramaniakumar was recently discharged from the hospital and his family members were waiting for him to breathe his last. Balasubramaniakumar's younger brother Saravanan, 70, had hired the freezer box on Monday. The agency that provided the freezer box was scheduled to take the box back on Tuesday.

However, on Tuesday, the official from the agency got a shock when he saw Balasubramaniakumar alive and in a semiconscious state with his hands and legs tied, in the box with the lid closed.

This incident shook my spirit. A sick old man battling in a freezer box for 24 hours, oh my God, what would be his heart's cry? This incident may be my mistake but honestly many old people go through a hell of suffering because of the negligence of family members due to old age

sickness. When they were young they were included in everything but in the most wanted stage they are completely rejected, why? Is it not true that we all would become babies in old age? And is it not very important to send them to eternity with dignity and peace? Snehan stands with such neglected ones. Soon if not all neglected old people at least some would have the privilege to end their life happily at Snehan's care.

incident made him unwanted and he could not get jobs easily. He had no other choice than to depend on the generosity of the by passers on the streets. He struggled hard to meet his basic needs, as especially nights are spend fearfully on the streets. Three years a go, Snehan founder was distributing food on the streets; Poopathi approached him for one pack. Anumuthu looked at him and told him why don't you go to work? For this food packs are meant for old and sick persons on street. Then he looked at Anumuthu and said, everyone, thinks I am old and disabled, with this conversation he opened his heart's cry Snehan. Now, last one-year Mr.Poopathi is working happily with Snehan, his life changed, his appearance changed, and he eats with his At Snehan's for earning. incomegenerating activities, he is the main incharge person. We can see him smiling always and ready to do any work at any time. Snehan is happy to include the neglected and bring meaning to their lives.

She has told her parents several times that she doesn't want to go to work because she doesn't have a toilet facility in her office. Saranya has gone to work without any other way after her parents insisted that she must go to work because of the government job. In the current situation of continuous rain, Saranya has gone to the house near the office to use a toilet, due to heavy rain and bad quality of construction, the tiles broke and fell into an eight-feetdeep septic tank and drowned in wastewater when she stepped on the open space of a septic tank which was not covered with a suitable lid. What an injustice that the government did to Saranya?
